ALL ENTRIES MUST BE DONE BY STUDENTS!

- A. No entries or pre-registration through Fair Board Office. No entry fees needed.
- B. All exhibits must be substantial enough to be moved. Please note required size, material and mounting or entry will be disqualified. Please note number of exhibits per classroom.
- C. **All Categories** are to be brought to the General Exhibits Building on the Markham Fair Grounds (McCowan and Elgin Mills Road) on **Friday, September 27 from 3:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. or Saturday, September 28, from 9:00 to 9:45a.m. sharp.**
- D. The student or class name and school must be printed on the back of each entry. Please remember 1 entry per student per category.
- E. **Schools must pick up exhibits between 6:30 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. on Sunday, October 6. Alternately, exhibits may be picked up on Monday, October 7 between 4:00 and 5:30p.m. Exhibits will not be kept after October 11.**
- F. All exhibits must be made since last year's Markham Fair and **must be the work of the exhibitor.** The pupil must be in the grade designated for each category when the work is completed. As of July 1, pupils are considered to be in their new grade. Students in special education classes may compete in the grade level in which they are working.
- G. No tracing or kits allowed.
- H. **Each entry must have an entry tag with the school name, and the exhibitor's first name and last name or last initial. Attach tag to the upper right hand corner.** Tags can be obtained by contacting the Fair office at 905-642-FAIR or by e-mailing schoolchildrens@markhamfair.ca.
- I. Work must be done by **one (1)** student, excluding categories #10-15 and #90
- J. Not more than **six (6)** entries per class, per category.

ALL categories may be completed at school or at home.

PAINTING CATEGORIES #37- 43:

Please note Rules Note Rules D, G, I, and J No Borders.

37. Nursery and Kindergarten - A finger painting - approximately 12" x 18".
38. Kindergarten and Grade 1—A fruit or vegetable print picture - approximately 12" x 18".
39. Kindergarten, Grades 1 and 2 - A painting using tempera paint - not to exceed 12" x 18".
40. Grades 3 and 4 - A painting using tempera paint - not to exceed 12" x 18".
41. Grades 5 and 6 - A painting using only water colours - not to exceed 12"x18" .
42. Grades 7 and 8 - A painting using only water colours- not to exceed 12"x18" .
43. Grades 6, 7 and 8 - An acrylic painting - not to exceed 12" x 18" .

PLASTICINE CATEGORIES #44 - 47:

Please note Rules D, G, I, and J. Not to exceed 12"(30cm)

63. Grades 2, 3 and 4 - A cut (or torn) and paste picture **using paper only** - not to exceed 12" x 18".
64. Grades 5 and 6 - A black and white drawing of one or more animals or birds - not mounted - not to exceed 12" x 18" .
65. Grades 7 and 8 - A black and white drawing of one or more animals or birds - not mounted - not to exceed 12" x 18".
66. Grades 5 and 6 - A black and white drawing of **only one** building - not mounted - not to exceed 12" x 18".
67. Grades 7 and 8 - A black and white drawing of **only one** building - not mounted - not to exceed 12" x 18" .
68. Nursery, Kindergarten, and Grade 1 - A picture using fabric

and yarn only - not to exceed 12" x 18" .

69. Grades 2 to 3 - A picture using fabric and yarn only - not to exceed 12" x 18" .
70. Grades 5 to 8 - An **original** 3-6 frame comic strip - not to exceed 8 1/2" x 11" .
71. Grades 5 to 8 - A sculpture using wire only - **self supporting** - not to exceed 15" (38cm) any side.
72. Kindergarten, Grades 1 to 4 - Create a picture on cardboard using found natural materials - not to exceed 8 1/2" x 11" .

79. A small sculpture using any medium, excluding plasticine. Limited to 5" (12.7 cm). Mounted on a firm base.
80. One decorated functional flower pot (empty) - not to exceed 8" (20.5cm) overall.
81. Using small rocks, make a rock star or band. Mounted on a firm base. Exhibit not to exceed 12"(30cm)
82. A popsicle stick creation- not to exceed 12"(30cm) overall.
83. Create a diorama of a natural habitat in a shoebox. Open on one side. Handmade or natural contents only. **Note: Awards**
84. Make a musical instrument.
85. **NEW!** Make a model of a Canadian Landmark or artifact. Not to exceed 12" (30 cm)
86. Miniature scarecrow - self supporting - not to exceed 18" (45.5 cm) in any direction. **Note: Awards**
87. Make a model of a farm machine. Not to exceed 12" (30cm)
88. Paint a face on a harvest vegetable. No pumpkins.
89. **NEW!** Decorate a small pumpkin with paint. No carving please.
